Do	Don't
<ul> <li>Focus on your child's work.</li> <li>Ask your child questions: <ul> <li>"Tell me more about"</li> <li>"Tell me what you are you thinking."</li> <li>"Is there another way you could do that?"</li> </ul> </li> <li>Give your child specific feedback: <ul> <li>"I like the way you"</li> <li>"Great work on"</li> </ul> </li> <li>Be aware of the time. You will need to stay focused and on-task to complete</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Don't</li> <li>Bring siblings. They distract you from your child and the work being completed.</li> <li>Bring too many adult family members. There will most likely be 4 families in our room at one time. When parents and grandparents come, our room becomes way too squishy.</li> <li>Make general comments like, "Good job."</li> <li>Talk on your cellphone or to other parents while your child is showing you</li> </ul>
